Saltford Road Works

Government policy is to hand over full responsibility for certain major roads to the local authority, a move which B&NES has been contesting for some time.

On 22 March, InterRoute, sponsored by the Highway Agency, called a meeting to discuss construction tactics. They invited various Road Users, businesses and local bodies, which included 2 SCA members representing villagers, to give their views about the scheme and its problems.

- The scheme will cost £1.5 million.
- It will commence at the Globe roundabout and terminate at Grange Road.
- Many thousands of tons of material will be shifted daily and therefore any en-route traffic lights will not be acceptable.
- The whole section will be **Gated** and **ONLY** buses and emergency services will have linear access.
- ALL other traffic will be diverted but access for residents and businesses will be maintained except for 6 weekends when the final road coat is being laid.
- There are 3 options with regard to the construction programme;
 - 1. 9 weeks duration
 - 2. 12 weeks duration
 - 3. 19 weeks duration
- The representatives were unanimously in favour of Option 1
- This means that July, August and September are going to be a difficult period for all Bath Road users.

We were also informed that more information would be made public in due course and that householders will be individually contacted. In the mean time, please do not contact SCA representatives. If you require further information, contact B&NES (01225 477000)



SALTFORD PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Saltford Parish Council Costs

Sattford Parish Council has set the precept for Council Tax in the year 2006-07 at £27500, the same amount as set in the financial year of 2003-04. That amounts to on average just over £6 for each resident of Sattford.

What the Council Do

During the year, the Parish Council examines and comments upon all planning applications and any issues that are referred to them which may impact on residents or the environment. It also assists local organisations with grants and makes representations on their behalf to Bath and North East Somerset Council.

There are 11 Councillors and it is estimated that on average they devote **freely** 15hrs time each month to Parish matters.

Skate/BMX Park in Saltford

Some of our younger residents recently presented the Parish Council with their case for a skate/BMX park in Saltford and the idea is now being considered by the Environmental Committee on behalf of the Main Council. There are many issues to be addressed before a recommendation can be made, key amongst these being finance and a suitable site. As a first estimate we are assuming that the cost will be similar to that in Keynsham Memorial Park, which cost in the order of £50,000; whatever figure finally emerges, the challenge will be to obtain grants to cover most of the money in order for the project to go ahead.

Identifying and obtaining a suitable site is also presenting a problem as space available to us is limited and we are very conscious of the potential environmental impact of such a park close to housing. The Parish Council is presently investigating suitable sites and would welcome offers from the local community into possible sites, prior to a full consultation. The area required is around the 500sqm (25mx20m).

There will be further communications as and when there is something firmer to say; in the meantime, if you have any views on the subject please drop a line to the Parish Clerk - or come along to a meeting of the Environmental Committee.

The Annual Parish Meeting at which residents are invited to voice any concerns that they have will be held at 6.30pm Tuesday 4th April 2006 in the Avon Room, Saltford Community Hall. It is also an opportunity to hear reports presented by various local organisations and their plans for the future.
