



Saltford Parish Council News

Parish Council Elections are being held on Thursday 5 May, along with elections for Bath & North East Somerset Council and a nationwide referendum on the voting system. Now is the time to think about standing for your local council and having a say in issues affecting Saltford.

At the last election in 2007, we had only 6 applications for the 11 members of the Parish Council. The Parish Council has an important role in looking after the interests of the people of Saltford, in particular, ensuring that the services from B&NES, Police, Central Government and other public bodies meet our requirements. The Council also has the statutory right to comment on all Planning Applications in the parish.

Please consider getting nominated to become a Councillor. The basic commitment is to the monthly meeting held on the first Tuesday of the month at 7.15pm until about 9pm. In addition, there is a meeting for those who are interested on the 3rd Tuesday, to look at planning matters. Councillors can also take a part in negotiations with other organisations and initiate projects with the status of Parish Councillor. To qualify you must be at least 18 years of age and live or work in Saltford or within 3 miles of Saltford. The closing date for the delivery of nomination papers is Monday 4 April.

The nomination paper must be signed by two electors of Saltford as proposer and seconder, and candidates must also complete a consent to nomination form. Nomination papers can be obtained from me or from Bath & North East Somerset's Electoral Services Office at the Guildhall, Bath (tel: 01225 477333 email: elections@bathnes.gov.uk), to whom they need to be returned by 4 April.

Air quality in Saltford

B&NES have recommended that an Air Quality Management Area is declared close to The Crown on the Bath Road, following an assessment of air quality in Saltford which showed that the nitrogen dioxide annual average is above the government's objectives in this area. There will be a consultation on this and a continuous analyser is to be placed in The Crown for a temporary period from July 2011 in order to achieve a higher level of detail and accuracy of air pollution levels in Saltford.

A Good Childhood in Saltford



Over the last 2 months the Children's Society have been holding a series of 'Good Childhood' Conversations in Saltford. The events have seen up to 30 people attend, including many young people and children. The overwhelming message of these events has been the need to say hello. Where there is fear, or a perception of fear especially towards groups of young people or from young people worried about adults' reactions, the consensus has been that a simple hello or a smile could help reduce the fear of a reaction. Most people have said they enjoy living in Saltford and that they do not fear any anti-social behaviour.

An idea has been put forward to launch a *Skills Swap Shop* at the summer festival in June. This would provide an exciting opportunity for all ages to get together and share their interests, skills and experience. Suggestions so far have been in the realms of textiles- particularly dress making, engineering and making go-carts, and film-making, alongside art, knitting and computer skills.


