PRECEPT

Good housekeeping has enabled the Council to reduce it's precept for 1996/97 by £2,000.

A4 TRUNK ROAD

It is taking a long time, but already the section between the village and Keynsham shows a marked reduction in traffic speeds. There are two more traffic islands to install west of the Grange Road junction, more work to be carried out at the Norman Road junction and then improvements will start at the Beech Road/Manor Road junction. The extended 30mph and 40mph zones will be enforceable when the signs are erected and illuminated. The provision of a second pedestrian crossing at Beech Road/Manor Road is programmed for the 1996/97 financial year, and a bid has been made to the Highway's Agency for a speed camera on the Bath Hill.

MERRY GO ROUND LOCAL BUS

Following intervention by local authorities, significant cuts to this service have been avoided for the coming year. A new schedule with no overall reduction in services - but changed timings - will operate from 1st April. A copy is displayed on the Parish Council noticeboard by the Post Office.

VANDALISM ETC

There has been publicity recently about telephoning 999 to report incidents to the Police. Inspector Wright from Keynsham says that 999 should be used to report any incidents at the time they are taking place the operator will route calls according to urgency. Please continue to report anything you see. We are pleased to note that in a recent Housing Strategy document from BANES Council they commit themselves to co-operation with local organisations to combat anti-social activity including installation of extra street lighting, & fencing.

ALLOTMENTS

The Parish Council would be pleased to provide allotments in response to residents' requests, but this is dependent on suitable accessible land being available. As the Council owns no land, privately owned sites are being investigated as well as enquiries into a garden/property sharing scheme operating elsewhere - let us know if you might be interested.

HORNBY WOOD

The Parish Council has obtained grants to enable major tree planting to take place at Hornby Wood, off Manor Road (just past the Courtney Road junction). We are grateful to the owner for allowing public access.

FOOTPATHS

In consultation with the Parish Council, Avon County Council has completed a review of footpaths to the north of the Parish. The Parish Council will produce a map of the recently redesignated rights of way, on which new stiles and marker posts have been erected.

FAREWELL TO WANSDYKE

Those who think of Saltford's future in planning terms will view Wansdyke's passing with very real regret. For, since last 'reorganisation' in 1974 when we waved goodbye to Keynsham UDC. Saltford has enjoyed (bar the occasional hiccup) the full support of Wansdyke in all major planning issues. Dear Richard,

I should like to record my gratitude for the many kind comments that have been made recently as I stood down as conductor of Saltford Singers. A typographical error in the Feb/Mar edition of SCAN added an "r" to the word "fine" and was pointed out to me with regret by the type-setter (I am not in a position to criticise - my typing skills leave a lot to be desired and I have even been known to transfer them to the organ keyboard at times!!), but fine is a very appropriate word.
