IMPROVEMENTS AT SALTFORD HALL DURING AUGUST

During August the Hall is to be given a complete new overclad roof which will be goose grey in colour and greatly enhance the appearance of the Hall as well as ensuring that the building is weatherproof for the future. Inside, the Foyer will be completely overhauled and have a smart new honey coloured floor, a new ceiling and lighting system and the well worn bar will be replaced with a new one on the Avon Room side of the foyer. You will also find that the Avon Room door will be in a new position once the work is complete. We hope that you will all like it!

To achieve this, scaffolding and site fencing will be erected around the hall from about 26th July until completion in late August. Thus the main hall building will be out of use but some bookings will continue in the Wansdyke room which will be unaffected by the work. (See also the notes from the booking office on page 5)

All the main works are being done by contractors but the Building Committee are carrying out some of the decorating and dismantling work. This will take place at various times during the programme. You will also find a note on page 7 indicating that there will be a celebration "official opening" of the new work on 2nd October.

THE BLUE NOTE JAZZ BAND

The Blue Notes, formed in Bristol in the fifties, are one of the longest established bands on the British jazz scene. Most of the pubs they've played in have now been pulled down, so they've moved their Wednesday night club into the Undercroft of ancient St Mary Redcliffe in the fervent hope that even the road planners dare not demolish England's fairest parish church. Well known for their unusual sound (soprano sax instead of trumpet lead) the band has played at the Royal Albert Hallk and Berlin Philarmonic, aboard HMS Ark Royal, at festivals in Germany, Holland, Switzerland and Malta in streets, cowsheds and two cathedrals. There have been riverboat shuffles, train sheds, agricultural shows, weddings and funerals (including Lord Bath's).

building as well - some 400 in all. The exercise is to be repeated as we feel that regular attention makes the task slightly easier than an irregular blitz. We are hoping to carry out this work on Saturday 13 September 2003 and we will be contacting affiliated groups shortly to invite their participation.

FROM THE BOOKING OFFICE Would all users please note that the

repairs to the roof are planned for a four week period between Monday 28 July and Saturday 30 August 2003. It is quite likely that we shall have to exclude everyone from the main building for the whole of that period while the work is carried out although as plans are more firmly drawn up it may be possible to phase the activity so as to permit restricted access. Most users were warned in February when the January invoices were sent out but if your group has been overlooked then please make a note now and make sure the leaders know of the possible problem. Most groups can be accommodated in the Wansdyke Room but some will need to be cancelled. Booking Office and Postal Address Now that the office in the hall is the centre of operations it seems sensible to direct all mail there. Although in the past it was considered an additional attraction for vandals, a letter box is now installed for at least a trial period. New Club Officers & Programs

We are now at the end of the 2002/3 sessions and as they close for the summer several groups will have held AGMs where new officers may have been elected. Please let us have a note of any changes in personnel. We would be grateful for an early sight of the timetable of activities for the session beginning next September so that we can secure the room reservations for the regular users. It would also be an ideal time to review your time-slot. From the 1,440 entries in the diary in 1997 we have grown to more than 2,200 this year and there has been a corresponding increase in pressure on the caretakers time. There can be nothing more frustrating than to arrive at the hall to lock up or change over the layout than to find a session in full swing, especially as it may be the fourth or fifth visit to the hall that day. We can usually alter time slots but ask only that they are realistic -NOT event times but doors open and doors closed times.

SALTFORD PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

HISTORIC SALTFORD MAPS

We are delighted that this project has been successfully completed and are extremely grateful to the many people who have given their time and talents to make this possible. We would particularly like to thank Brian Dimery for erecting the notice boards free of charge. The Maps of Historic Saltford will be found on the newly installed notice boards which are situated outside the Post Office and beside the steps to the cycle path in the car park of The Bird In Hand. It is hoped that they will be enjoyed by Saltford residents and visitors alike.

'SLOW DOWN' SIGNS

We are looking at joining a B&NES scheme of installing temporary flashing 'Slow Down' signs that light up to indicate to the driver when their vehicles are exceeding the speed limit. We first tried these signs about two years ago in Norman Road, Grange Road and Manor Road. It was generally thought that these were effective and that we should seriously look into the question of using them again in suitable roads in Saltford for periods of two weeks at a time.

WHITE ADVISORY PARKING LINES

We are discussing with B&NES Highways the possibility of having more white advisory lines at the junctions of certain roads in Saltford. The corners of Rodney Road and Bath Road, Lansdown Road and Bath Road, are two locations that it was thought would benefit if white lines were installed.

20 mph SPEED RESTRICTION IN THE HIGH STREET AND THE SHALLOWS

We know it has been a long time coming but we can assure you that this scheme is still very much on the books and from our latest discussions with B&NES Highways they are aiming to complete it this year. At one stage it was thought that The Shallows would be excluded from the scheme but after discussions between B&NES Highways and the Police Authorities it has been agreed that The Shallows should be included in view of the number of visitors that enjoy the beauty of this part of our village particularly at weekends.

OVER HANGING FOLIAGE

At this time of the year we are inundated with complaints about overhanging foliage. We would ask all householders to step outside their properties and cut back any overhanging foliage that is growing beyond their boundary. Please remember that there are still many folk who regularly walk the pavements outside your house to and from the school, the shops and the buses and it is extremely annoying if one cannot pass each other without brushing into protruding bushes and ducking to avoid low branches at eye level. It is even worse when it is wet! Remember, too, that there are partially sighted people using our walkways and it is especially hazardous for them. If anyone is inconvenienced by this, then there is a telephone number to ring, which is B&NES Action Line 01225 394041. B&NES will write to the property owner requesting them to cut back the foliage and failure to do so within six weeks they instruct their Staff to do the necessary lopping and then charge the property owner accordingly.

SALTFORD PARISH COUNCIL RECYCLING NEWS

Garden Waste and Cardboard Composting Collections

Collections have begun to take place in Saltford of garden rubbish that is put out every other Thursday in the official B&NES green wheeled bins or in special sacks only obtainable from B&NES. Remember that any rubbish placed, packed, or put in any other container other than the official B&NES supplied bins or sacks will not be collected. To date B&NES have received orders for 2.700 green wheeled bins and over 4.000 sacks and there are some folk still waiting for delivery of these. B&NES are chasing up the suppliers, so if you are one of the unlucky ones still waiting to join in this scheme it should not be too long before you take delivery.

Cardboard will also be collected alongside the bins or sacks. Just flatten the cardboard and tie neatly in bundles with string or place in a cardboard box.

The rules are that the wheeled bin or sacks MUST NOT be used for your general rubbish and MUST NOT be left on the pavement at any time other than on your collection day. Please put your bin or sacks out at the FRONT edge of your property by 8.00 am on the day of collection so they are clearly visible to the collectors.

Horse Drawn Green Box Collection

Some parts of Saltford have their green boxes collected by horse drawn carts. Another horse has joined the team and is undergoing training at the moment. When this is completed B&NES hope to extend the rounds of the horse drawn carts. So gardeners, have your shovels at the ready!
