- 5 Not more than two prizes to be awarded to any one Exhibitor in any one class.
- All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor and must have been in his or her possession for sixty days at least. Cut Flowers, Fruit and Vegetables must be the growth of their own gardens. The Committee reserve the right to examine any garden after receipt of entries. In the Homecraft, Handicrafts and Children's Sections, the exhibit must be the work of the Exhibitor.
- 7 The Committee reserve the right to refuse any entry.
- 8 All entries must be made on the proper Entry Forms and reach the Joint Show Secretary, Mr Brian Coombs, 12 Chelwood Road, Saltford by 5.00pm on Friday 13 September, 1996. Late entries will NOT be accepted under any circumstances. Postal entries may be paid for on staging.
- The Committee reserve the right to reduce the number of prizes in a Class in consultation with the Judges.
- 10 Entrance Fees: Open classes 20p per entry. Area Classes 15p per entry. Children's Classes 10p per entry.
- Any objections to the Judging must be lodged with a Joint Show Secretary together with a deposit of £1.00 before 4.30pm.

Financial Assistance

Over the past five years, the Parish Council has helped a wide range of Saltford organisations by giving grants, particularly for specific projects or helping to establish new ventures. Recent examples of financial help include Saltford School (benches for a quiet area within the overall playground development scheme) and the Saltford Stars Junior Football Club (new football kits). A commitment has also been made to help the Hinton Close Day Centre in the event of their grant from B&NES being reduced, and the valuable work of Victim Support in the village has also been recognised.

New Post Box

The Post Office has installed a new post box on the corner of Stratton Road and Broadway, following requests from residents in the area and continued pressure from the Parish Council. Please make sure that it is well used.

A4 Traffic Calming

The Parish Council is continuing to press the Highways Agency for the second pedestrian crossing (opposite the library) and a speed camera on Saltford Hill - it is hoped that these can be in place without too much further delay, although no timescales have been given. Thank you residents who passed on their comments before the last Council meeting.

A4 Cycle Track

The cycle track alongside the A4 to Keynsham has been in place some months, but concerns have been raised at the numbers of Wellsway School pupils who continue to cycle from Saltford the "back way" along Mañor Road. Wellsway School was instrumental in the cycle track being created and is encouraging their pupils to use this safer route to school.

Other Highway Matters

Discussions have taken place with B&NES Council for measures to reduce the traffic congestion caused by visiting cars parking in the narrowest part of High Street, to improve visibility for drivers coming out of The Batch and to discourage parking on the pavement under the Railway Cycle Track. Signs to the shops and school have been promised still for the near future.
