It is an opportunity to receive reports from many of the organisations in the village and to hear their plans for the future.

The Future of Keynsham Hospital

Keynsham hospital currently provides medical services to patients in the Bristol and Keynsham areas and also some in North Somerset and South Gloucestershire; however, the future provision of these services is in question and a period of consultation on proposals affecting the hospital has begun (running until Friday 17 February). The proposals cover provision of rehabilitation beds, respite care and the future of the building and site. The preferred options set out in the consultation document and affecting residents of the Keynsham/Saltford area are:

- Rehabilitation beds will be closed, being replaced by additional capacity in St Martins (Bath) and Paulton hospitals. There will also be an increase in community based care.
- Respite beds will be closed; alternative arrangements will be discussed with patients and families who currently rely on this service. Alternative provision will be made in future on a case-by-case basis.
- The hospital site will either be redeveloped for another health care use or sold-off with proceeds going to the NHS.

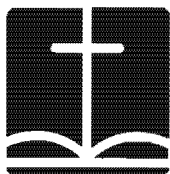
Keynsham Orchestra
