### SALTFORD PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

#### MAY COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Thursday 1st May 2003 was ELECTION DAY but as there were only eleven people who put their names forward to stand as Parish Councillors it proved to be an uncontested election. Of these eleven, seven are new faces to the Council and I welcome them all and will look forward to working with them for your benefit in our village. A full list of all Councillors appears on the Saltford Parish Council Notice Board outside the Post Office. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the retiring Councillors for their input at the many Council and Committee meetings over the past four years. A particular word of thanks must be expressed to Councillor Maurice Short (Retiring Chairman) who has been a tremendous help and encouragement to me and has achieved so much for all of us in this village having served 12 years on the Council, 6 of those years as Chairman-thank you Maurice

### BUS SHELTERS

A slight hitch has occurred - the Bus Shelter between The Glen and The Folly cannot be moved until further investigation of the many services that appear to be under the pavement. First of all telephone cables were in the way, then it was the drains - the problem continues. The Bus Shelter outside The Crown will be replaced by an enclosed one but this cannot take place until August/September time due to the heavy workload of the contractors. Regretfully the vandals who passed through Saltford recently smashing 26 panes of toughened glass in our new Bus Shelters will increase the cost of our insurance cover. To replace the glass will be in the region of £1.500.

### HISTORIC SALTFORD

By the time you read this I am keeping my fingers crossed that the new notice boards depicting a map of Historic Saltford will have been erected, one outside the Post Office and the other at the bottom of the steps in the car park of The Bird In Hand leading to the Cycle Path. We trust that everyone will find the information of interest.

### VEHICLE ENTRANCE TO THE CYCLE PATH IN AVON LANE

A lock is to be fitted to the gateway in Avon Lane leading onto the cycle path to stop quad bikes and cars from illegally travelling the path. Radar Keys for those who need them are available from all B & NES Council outlets. A notice asking that you keep the entrance clear for Emergency Service Vehicles to gain access in case of accident will be erected at this entrance in the very near future.

### **PUFFIN CROSSING**

This description is nothing whatsoever to do with the state some people are in having crossed the busy A4! I am assured that the new Puffin Lights that are in the process of being installed on the A4 will work in unison (I seem to have heard that somewhere before?) They are able to detect people on the crossing and will delay the traffic flow until the pedestrian crossing is clear of people, whereas the old crossing was on a timed basis

### GREEN WASTE AND CARDBOARD COLLECTION TRIAL

Paper: Newspaper, magazines, catalogues, directories, junk mail (remove plastic wrapper,

white paper and white envelopes, small amounts of shredded paper and Yellow Pages.

NO card, brown paper, brown envelopes or coloured office paper.

Glass: Any coloured glass bottle or jar.

NO broken glass or other types of glass: e.g. Pyrex, tumblers, window panes etc.

Cans: All food cans.

Foil: Clean aluminium foil e.g. milk bottle tops, take away trays etc. (please squash

together).

NO silver plastic e.g. crisp packets (Try the scrunch test - if it springs back, it's

not foil).

Textiles: All qualities of textiles and pairs of shoes -they must be clean and dry so

please put them in plastic bags to prevent them from getting wet (tie shoes in pairs)

NQ pillows, duvets or other stuffed items.

### Peter Gordon Thompson of Hillside Cottage, High Street.

When Peter died back in March, SCAN had just gone to press. This is the first time we have been able to announce his death and print a few words about him.

Readers may have read in the local press the more formal tributes I paid to him at the time, but March seems a long way off now. Because of this I would ask your forbearance to reflect on him in a more personal way because we were good friends for quite a few of the 40 years he lived in the village. Others in the High Street area knew him much longer than I.

It sometimes happens that, in a long association, people can change towards each other but, in his case, this was not so. To me, and to everyone who knew him, he was always a gentleman. A sprightly person, considerate of others with a ready sense of humour and a kindly word for anyone who stopped to have a chat with him on his many trips up the High Street to do a bit of shopping.

He spent 12 lonely years after his wife, Rosemary, died but I never heard him once grumble about his lot. What I did witness was his resilience in coping so
