A4 Saltford Road Works

An Update from BANES Ward Councillors Francine Haeberling and Gordon Wood

The Highways Agency intends to close the A4 to undertake major structural, resurfacing, drainage, and water utility works. We are urging the Highways Agency to put the needs of local residents and businesses first when making any decisions about how these works are carried out. In the week beginning 8 May, they announced what they intend to do.

- Work will commence on Monday 17th July for a period of approximately 9 weeks;

- Residents and businesses will be provided with permits and access will be maintained for residents, their visitors, businesses, and customers through a 24 hour manned gatehouse;

- A leaflet will be produced including details about the nature of the works, an explanation of how the permit system will work, and local diversion routes;

- An updated programme of works will be provided on a weekly basis.

We are going to be pressing the Highways Agency to complete these works in less than 9 weeks, if possible, and provide signage giving clear information to motorists about alternative routes. The message must get across that our community shops, pubs, and post office are open for business during the summer. We hope the residents of Saltford can support these businesses as much as they can.

As we understand the problem their main concern is to limit the amount of traffic that uses our village to get from A to B or, in the case of our two cities, from B to B. They are aware of the effect that the work will have on the life of Saltford residents and we have expressed our concerns about possible restrictions on Hall activities. Following the recent death of the proprietor of the Crown Garage, Bath Road, it was felt that a note should be made of its recent history. The garage has existed since the early 1930s and was then owned by Mr Bendall, a one time Brooklands racing driver. An advertisement of the era gives the Crown Garage telephone number as 'Saltford 3 for efficient and speedy service'. In the early 1950s the Crown sold Moskavitch cars and R.O.P (Russian Oil Products) petrol.

Keynsham & Saltford District Wine Circle

In March we had a tasting of commercial wines from Mumford's Vineyard presented by the owner, Mr Tony Cox. Tony gave us a most interesting slide show and talk that illustrated the origins and development of the vineyard over the past 15 years, leading up to the current annual production of 10,000 – 12,000 bottles. He then offered six different wines for tasting made from four varieties of grape: Madeleine Angevine, Kerner, Reichensteiner and Triomphe d'Alsace, and they proved to be quite superb. Mumford's wines are available in supermarkets in Bath.

In April our President, Percy Mellor, introduced the Members' Recipe that will be made for judgment at the December Wine Circle meeting.

Percy began by saying that Matthew Jukes, the Daily Mail wine correspondent, had tasted 25,000 wines in the course of the year but only 1% were thought worthy enough to be included in his book of the Best Wines available in this country.

Percy continued by reading out a couple of facts from the International Wine Magazine e.g.

Tickets for a tasting of the top 100 wines in the world were priced at £9,300.

The top 100 alcoholic drinks sales were: 1. Stella Artois; 2. Carling Black Label; 3. Fosters; 4. Harveys Bristol Cream. Smirnoff Vodka was the highest spirit drink on the list.

Percy reminded members that there would be a white wine competition at the June meeting, and offered two of his own excellent whites for tasting, together with a Rose. He said that the wines could be made from fruit juices e.g. Welch's white grape and apple or Welch's white grape and pear (for his dry white), or from fruits e.g. lychees, mangoes, pears, grapes, apples, rhubarb (for his sweet white). The Rose could easily be made using the dry white wine as a base, adding a small amount of sugar and then either making an infusion with redcurrants for three or four days or adding colouring e.g. cochineal.

After announcing that the Member's Recipe for December will be a red wine Percy gave the meeting a tasting of two kits, a Beavertdale Rioja and a Beavertdale Cabernet/Merlot, that he had made up for the occasion. Following a show of hands from the willing, our wine secretary David

O'Neill, went round to each of the members to find out which kit they would prefer to make.

Over the May Day bank holiday weekend a large group of our members spent the weekend at the Westminster Hotel in Ostend, with a visit to Bruges and a trip into Holland included. Although the North Wind made its presence felt, the weather was mostly kind and the combination of good food, good entertainment, good company and free drinks included after 8.30pm, all went to make a highly successful weekend. Coincidentally, (or maybe not) our friend Peter Coombs was able to buy a good selection of beers to provide the tastings for his talk in June on Belgian beers. Many thanks to our Chairman, Peter Church, for all the hard work that he put into organising the trip for us.

We are now at the planning stage for the summer's events: Boules competition; "Soiree"; Fancy Dress Dance; Annual Outing (this year to Cardiff Castle and Cardiff Bay).
