#### Evening of Jazz at Saltford Hall,

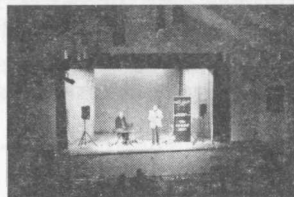

### Pride Of Saltford Partnership

#### For Total Community Inclusion "POSP – Big vision for the community" Local Residents present ideas at meeting

Over the past few months, work has progressed in attracting and building a group of likeminded dedicated people to work as part of the POSP Steering Group. Strategy and planning has taken place.

The first major milestone has been achieved through a local residents' meeting. 70 local households in the area of Wedmore Road (who have direct line of sight onto the facilities and, if any changes are achieved in the future, would possibly see a visual change) were invited to a public meeting held in the Wansdyke Room on the 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2010. The evening was very successful and enjoyable. The meeting started with an introduction about POSP and what has been done and future plans for going forward with the project. The local residents then broke down into groups and got involved in an exercise set to discuss topics around ideas, issues, solutions and concerns regarding the future of the facilities at Wedmore Road. The sessions were facilitated by members of the POSP Steering Group and supported by Councillor Francine Heaberling. To our delight, all the residents fully engaged and produced many ideas, issues, solutions and concerns which the POSP Steering Group can now take forward into the next stage of the process.

possible solutions and plans, the local residents will be invited back to discuss further these selections of solutions on the table to hopefully move on to agree on one definitive plan to move to the next stage in the process of the Wedmore facilities regeneration project.



### Saltford Parish Plan

#### The Questionnaire Results Read the Facts and Figures

As you will probably be aware from previous Parish Plan articles in SCAN, the last year has been a full one drafting, producing, distributing and collecting the questionnaire and getting the responses analysed. The major portion of the time was taken up with debating, drafting and formulating the questions. Then came the designing and layout of the Questionnaire to ensure that it would be readily accepted and understood by you all and completed!

Needless to say, this took longer than envisaged, three months longer, but it was imperative that we spent the time and effort to get it right. After obtaining competitive quotes, the 20 page Questionnaire was printed in August '09 and 1650 of them were hand delivered and collected throughout the village during the months of September and October by 57 volunteers and members of the Steering Group. Two weeks prior to this, three banners and a number of posters in the village, and posters at the two A4 entrances declared "Have your Say – Complete the Questionnaire".

came back with the outstanding response of over 70% returns! We know of no other village, especially one of our size (population over 4000 in 1600 homes plus around 50 businesses), which has had anywhere near such a result.

This then gave us a problem which we had not envisaged. 1128 returned Questionnaires, each with 122 tick boxes and 59 comment boxes, gave us a huge amount of information to collate and analyse. We had become victims of our own success. For the Steering Group to attempt this analysis would have been an impossible task within a reasonable time scale, with no certainty of a meaningful result. We needed professional assistance to analyse the responses to the Questionnaire and to collate the comments made.

People certainly did want to make their views known and this was born out by the staggering number of over 15,000 comments that were recorded in the Report worksheets!

The Questionnaire Analysis Report containing a lot of interesting facts and figures about your views on our Village is now complete and is available on the **Parish Council Website**. [www.saltford.org.uk](http://www.saltford.org.uk) (Click on Local Saltford Organisations).

We are now short listing the key issues and objectives arising from the results of the analysis to determine the actions to achieve them, and hope to **publish them in the Parish Plan in July – THEN THE PLAN HAS TO BE ACHIEVED!**

Well not exactly your country but the Salford Community Association (SCA) certainly needs your help. The SCA is a charity set up to administer Salford Hall and provide information for the benefit of the local community. An important method of providing you with information is via SCAN. Owing to a reduction in advertising revenue the production of SCAN is running at a small loss. We feel SCAN is an essential publication for Salford and you agree! In the Parish Plan survey carried out last year over 90% of respondents felt they receive most of their local information from this publication.

Last year we tried something different in our method of collecting donations, and to be honest it wasn't that successful. Whilst we much appreciate those that did donate, the total donations for last year were less than 50% of the previous years. This is an unfortunate situation that has coincided with increasing costs for the Association.

Just before Christmas we included an envelope within SCAN and asked for your donations. This method was chosen because it was less labour intensive with no reliance on finding volunteers to knock on doors asking for donations; the method adopted in previous years.

We are repeating the envelope collection once again for 2010 and you will find the envelope for your donation in this SCAN. We would encourage anyone who wishes to give a donation for 2010 to use the enclosed envelope and hand it in to the Booking Office at Salford Hall or Salford News or place it through the door of 3 Claverton Road, 3 Kingston Avenue or 24 High Street.

You will notice that the envelope carries a Gift Aid declaration. If you are a UK taxpayer and are happy to Gift Aid your donation and provide some basic information, this will boost your donation by 28% if you are a basic rate taxpayer at no cost to yourself.

The SCA would also like to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support in attending many of the varied fundraising events staged throughout the year. These fundraising events are essential to help improve the financial position and enable the Association to continue to provide a service to the local community. So please keep on giving your support – we need it! We hope to see you at many of our future events planned for the rest of 2010 – See below for details.

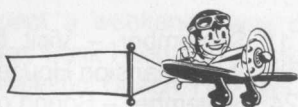
