Barking Dogs

This Council has received complaints from various areas of the village about dogs making a lot of noise at night. One sets another off and this can be very annoying and frustrating for those wanting to get some shut-eye. 20 mph Speed Limit

We are slowly moving towards achieving the 20 mph speed limit that has been in discussion stage for years. You will have seen a notice on the Parish Council Notice Board calling for any objections and representations by 6th October 2003 to the proposed scheme and, provided all goes smoothly, we hope to see this scheme in operation up and running before Christmas 2003 in the following roads: High Street; Homefield Road; Mead Lane; The Batch; The Shallows.

Slow Down Road Signs

During the months of October, November and December, flashing 'Slow Down' signs will be situated at two locations in the village, a fortnight at each site. The areas chosen are Norman road near to the junction of Brockley Road and Manor Road near to the junction of Longwood Lane and the commencement of Montague Road. It is hoped that these flashing reminders to drivers of vehicles exceeding the 30 mph speed limit will slow the speed down in our side roads. Just think, if ever they were placed on the Bath Road the batteries would not last a day as 'SLOW DOWN' would be displayed permanently.

Bonfires

Please remember that other people living nearby might not necessarily want to inhale the smoke and fumes of your bonfire, especially during the fine days and evenings with windows open.

Environmental Committee

The Chairman of this Committee would like to hear from anyone who has any concerns about matters currently affecting the village. If you have views on how you would like to see it develop in the future, please contact any of our Parish Councillors.

In the past this Committee has been instrumental in achieving many successes, for example the new larger post box in Victoria Road replacing the smaller one that was once in Claverton Road West; the repainting of all the telephone boxes in Saltford; Historic Saltford Maps (regretfully copies of these are not available for sale); the planting of the Copper Beech Tree in the Memorial Garden in commemoration of the Queen's Golden Jubilee; dropped kerbs at road junctions; to name a few recent ones.

SALTFORD PARISH COUNCIL RECYCLING NEWS

Kerbside Recycling Service

More and more people are using the weekly collections which now include paper and magazines, glass bottles and jars, food and drink cans, clothes, shoes, plastic bottles, aluminium foil, yellow pages, engine oil, oil filters, car batteries, toner and ink cartridges, mobile phones and spectacles. If you need a green box or smaller basket, call the Action Line. If you live in a flat or a place where you cannot use a green box or basket, again contact the Action line and an alternative service will be provided.

Garden Waste and Cardboard Collection

This new fortnightly service was commenced in June and is proving to be very popular. To take part you need either to use a wheeled bin from the Council or their paper sacks. Paper sacks are available from Keynsham Town Hall and can also be ordered by telephone but a minimum order of 10 sacks is required. Cardboard is collected free. You don't need a container for this. Garden waste and cardboard collected is taken to Queen Charlton for composting. The compost product is sold on to the public and the horticultural industry.
