

PERMISSIVE FOOTPATHS TO STAY OPEN AROUND SALTFORD

Permissive footpaths south and west of Saltford, which had been closed at the end of 2013 following the withdrawal of subsidy for public access by DEFRA, were re-opened to the public at the end of 2014. Following a packed public meeting, Eveleighs Estate Agents came forward to fund the first year of a legal arrangement between Saltford Community Association (SCA) and local farmer Mr Adam Stratton. Each year subsequently the SCA has been trying to raise £3,000 to keep the permissive footpaths around the village open for another year. We are delighted to announce that I J McGill Transport Ltd have approached the SCA and generously donated £700.00 to enable us to reach the target for this year. This will enable these paths to remain open to at least the end of October 2017.

Without this generous donation from I J McGill's to cover the shortfall in our second year, over 4.5km of permissive paths would be closed, possibly for ever. This would be a terrible shame as it is a haven for walkers, dog walkers and horse riders. A massive thank you to McGill's for their generous donation.

John Davies, Chair of the SCA says "A huge thank you to everyone who has generously donated and particularly to I J McGill Transport for their generous donation. We will now start accepting donations for the following year, but we won't be distributing donation envelopes for a couple of months yet. If you want to donate now then

AFFILIATED ORGANISATIONS

KEYNSHAM AND SAITFORD PROBUS CLUB

Since the publication of the November issue of SCAN there have been two meetings of the Keynsham & Saltford Probus Club.

In September, members were treated, by Tim Lewis and Sheila Furneaux, to their presentation 'GLORIOUS MUD'. As the name suggests, this was a biographical and musical look back on the collaboration of actor and singer Michael Flanders and composer and pianist Donald Swann. Using a power point presentation including photos and cartoons, Tim and Sheila thoroughly entertained the Club with reminiscences and songs from the Flanders and Swann repertoire:- The Hippopotamus Song, The Gnu Song, The Slow Train (a parody on the cuts to British Railways following Dr Beeching's report in the 1960s) and Transport of Delight (the London omnibus song). A wonderful presentation, greatly enjoyed by all.

In a contrast of subject matter, 'The Port of Bristol Today' was the title of returning speaker Peter Gossen's illustrated talk at the October meeting. Peter, who was a Chief Engineer in the Merchant Navy, discussed the development of the Royal Portbury and Avonmouth Docks. The former is a major port for the import and export of motor vehicles and coal, handling some 450,000 vehicles and a million tons of coal each year, while Avonmouth is one of the UK's major ports for chilled fruit and vegetables as well as accommodating the Bristol Cruise Terminal. Peter impressed his listeners with his detailed knowledge, not only of the individual ships - their size, construction, history and probably what was normally served at dinner - but also of the complex infrastructure of the two ports - for example, the differences in unloading using either a 'bucket wheel' or a 'grab' (these have a capacity of 20 tons and are never overfilled, to avoid spillage). Peter concluded his talk with some thoughts about the future of the docks: the proposal for a new freight terminal; a deep-water channel from the Barry Pilot Station to the Port; the possible construction of a tidal barrage, which would seriously impact the Port activities.

The Keynsham and Saltford Probus Club meets at Keynsham Rugby Club on the fourth Friday of each month, for lunch and a talk by an invited speaker, and on the second Friday of the month, for coffee and informal chat."

The 2016-17 season is now underway for all our teams with varying degrees of success. Our First team is sitting in 2nd place in the Somerset County League, a creditable performance which will lead to promotion if they can stick at it until the end of the season. The adult reserve team are sitting 7th in the Mid-Somerset league but do have games in hand over the 2 teams above them. I think the Under 18's, who play in the Bristol and Gloucestershire League, are finding the step up a bit steep and are lingering in 8th place - I'm sure they will improve as the season progresses and come into their own next season when they will continue to play in the same league. One success story is our Under 15 team who are battling away in the Avon Youth League and are currently 4th in their division but with a game in hand over local rivals Brislington who are 3rd. The remainder of our junior teams play in their respective age group divisions within the Midsomer Norton and District Youth Football League where the good news continues with our Under 14's who are doing extremely well and are currently sitting 2nd. Unfortunately the Under 13 and Under 12 squads have yet to win a match this season after three games each – hopefully they will get their first successes soon and build on those for the rest of the season. We also have 5 teams ranging from Under 11's down to the Mini's (some of whom are 6) but results and league tables are not published for these teams. I'm sure however they are enjoying their football and we look forward to them coming up through the age groups over the coming years.

As always fixture and results can be found on the Saltford FC website which we try to keep as up to date as possible. Please do come down and support one or more of our teams. We play all our home matches on the pitches behind the village hall and the Sports Club is usually open during matches. We are a friendly club and new spectators, and players, are always welcome.

We are aware of some comments over the language used by some of our adult players. This has been taken up with the relevant managers and hopefully by the time this drops through letter boxes things will have improved, but do remember that the lads can get carried away at times!

As you will see from the above we have players as young as 6 at both training sessions and matches on the pitches behind the village hall. Quite often we find dog mess on these pitches and have to ensure that our players avoid it by spending time removing it. I am also aware that other users of the area are affected by the problem. Could we therefore please ask that dog walkers take care to remove any dog mess from the area please?

Work goes on for the Project team to keep the site in good shape and continue our development of interpretation displays, models and full scale replicas as well as maintaining our working 18 feet 11 inch water-wheel. Saltford Mill was in use from the 1720s

until 1925 for the manufacture of brass 'hollowware' (pans, vats and kettles) and brass sheet. The remaining wheel survived because it was adapted to drive a dynamo to light a squash court built in the mill in the late 1920s and then to drive water-powered tools for the boatvard.

OTHER NEWS

GRANT RECEIVED FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO STAGE AT SALTFORD HALL

The SCA are very grateful to Francine Haeberling for providing a substantial grant through the Ward Councillor Initiative (WCI). This is enabling us to undertake the following significant improvements:

- 1. Complete the replacement of the original 1950s lighting with modern low energy LEDs. This process started about 4 years ago with another grant through the WCI. Our existing lighting is heavy on energy usage and has to have colour gels put into them prior to any performance which limits its versatility as it is not usually possible to change these gels once a performance is underway. Replacing the existing lighting will provide the stage user with a multitude of lighting colours which will light the rear half of the stage. The colours will be able to be changed throughout any performance.
- 2. New LED lights on the floor at the front of stage will illuminate the front half of the stage. Having lights on the floor at the front of stage allows performers to have their faces better illuminated as all lights currently at the hall light downwards which can cause shadows especially if the performers are wearing hats. The colours will be able to be changed throughout any performance.

3.Install an additional set of drapes down the sides of the stage and across the top. A couple of years ago when we replaced our previous worn out stage clothes we didn't have the money for the required 3 sets and therefore have made do with only 2 sets since. This has caused various productions some problems with gaps on the wings.

These further improvements to the stage facilities we offer at Saltford Hall will be enjoyed in particular by Saltford Panto Club, SCA Musical Productions (SCAMP) and Lucy Ratnett's Dance Club, which involve large numbers of local children, plus Saltford Drama Club. Come and see them in action at the next Panto in January 2017.

BOUNDARY CHANGES - Jacob Rees-Mogg

The recently announced boundary changes have been quite the talking point in Parliament and in constituencies across the country.

I support the proposals to reduce the number of MPs in the House of Commons as doing so will regularise the size of constituencies, which currently vary from 40,492 in Arfon, North Wales, to 91,987 in Ilford South and 108,804 on the Isle of Wight.

Whilst I am disappointed that I will be losing villages such as Peasedown St. John and Batheaston, I am delighted to be retaining Saltford, despite earlier proposals which suggested that it would have been removed from the constituency.

ADMIRAL KELLY'S BLUE PLAQUE AT SALTFORD HOUSE

On 1st October 2016 the MP for North East Somerset, Jacob Rees-Mogg, unveiled a Blue Plaque at Saltford House, High Street, Saltford commemorating Admiral Benedictus Marwood Kelly (naval officer, liberator of slaves, benefactor) who lived in Saltford from 1856 until 1867.



Jacob Rees-Mogg said "It is important that local communities celebrate and mark those who once lived amongst them and had made a contribution to important issues such as the abolition of slavery. I, therefore, very much welcome the work by Saltford Environment Group and Saltford Parish Council to celebrate Admiral Kelly and to revive his memory in his local community and further afield so that more

people may learn about his remarkable life."

Chairman of Saltford Environment Group Phil Harding, who had carried out extensive research on Admiral Kelly, said: "We were astounded to discover what a remarkable life Admiral Kelly had lived, his contribution to help end slavery, and significant support for the education of children in the 19th Century. His lifetime of serving his country and helping those in greatest need can inspire others. We here in Saltford were delighted that Bath and North East Somerset Council gave planning permission for the Admiral's blue plaque to mark this former resident's important contribution to a better society."

Admiral Kelly will be a theme for the biennial Saltford Festival in June 2017 as 2017 will be the 150th anniversary of Admiral Kelly's death. His widow, the philanthropist Juliana Kelly, 7 years after his death paid for the re-building of Saltford School in 1874 that is now Saltford's Church hall.



Christmas & New Year Recycling & Rubbish Collections 2016/17

Happy Christmas and thank you for all you have recycled this year. Look out for an envelope coming through your door by early December with more information about your collection service at Christmas, your garden waste calendar for 2017 and details of all the Council's waste and recycling services.

Recycling and Rubbish collections

There will be NO recycling and rubbish collections on Monday 26 December. If your collection is due on this day, your next collection will be on Monday 2 January. All other collection days will remain the same, even if they fall on a Bank Holiday.

Garden waste and Christmas tree collections

There will be no garden waste collections for 2 weeks from 26 December to 6 January 2017. Normal collections will start again from Monday 9 January. The Council will collect your real Christmas tree from 9-27 January as part of the **fortnightly** garden waste collection. or please take it to your nearest Recycling Centre if you can.

Please cut your tree if it is more than 1.2 metres tall so that it will fit into the vehicles and remove the pot and any decorations. Put it at the edge of your property on your collection day so that the crews can see it easily. Please do not leave your tree on the street before collection day. To find out which week your tree will be collected, please check the Council's website or garden waste calendar.

Recycling Centre closures

The Recycling Centres will be closed on Christmas Day (25 Dec), Boxing Day (26 Dec) and New Year's Day (1 Jan). They will be open as usual on all other days.




