Saltford Stars U14's – Double Winners !!

Fantastic teamwork to win both the Midsomer Norton League and Knockout Trophy last week against Chew Valley at Chilcompton.

From looking out the window the football season must be over as the good weather has arrived and indeed all Saltford FC teams have completed their quota of matches for the season with varying degrees of success.

Starting with the senior teams our First team took the County Division 2 East Championship losing only 1 league game during the season – and even that to an unfortunate decision. To maintain this level of performance over the season is a great result and we look forward to the 2017/18 season in division one. Our Reserve team finished 5th in the Mid-Somerset 2nd Division – another very good result given the issues around player numbers. Overall things look good for the future.

Our junior teams have on the whole also had a successful campaign. Both our Under 18's and 15's finished comfortably in the top half of their respective leagues whilst our Under 14 team finished top of the Midsomer Norton League Under 14 Division – our second Champions of the season. As if this wasn't enough they went on to win the Under 14

Knockout Cup – a fantastic double which bodes very well for the future. Unfortunately our Under 13 and Under 12 teams finished in the bottom half of their respective leagues.

We also have teams at Under 10, 9, and 8 plus our Mini's, but under FA rules their results and league positions are not published but judging by the squad sizes they are enjoying their football and it looks good for the coming seasons.

Now that we are in the football closed season it gives us a chance to look to the future of the club from a financial and organisation viewpoint. The last issue of SCAN (where we appeared to go undercover as Keynsham FC) gave an outline of the financials and as always we are looking for ways and means of improving the position. But there is also the organisation side which is an equally important aspect. We are always on the lookout for new coaches (we will pay for training) and other helpers, either to support the individual teams, the club as a whole, or to help prepare the pitch on match days. Several local organisations have already arranged visits and, having honed their answers to some pretty penetrating questions from the Year 4 pupils from Saltford Primary school earlier this year; our guides are looking forward to a visit from 1st Saltford Brownies during the Summer.

Saltford Brass Mill was in use from the 1720s until 1925 for the manufacture of brass pans, vats and kettles and brass sheet. There were four waterwheels and four annealing furnaces. The remaining waterwheel survived because it was adapted to drive a dynamo to light a squash court built in the mill in the late 1920s. The single standing annealing furnace structure survived as a wine cellar in the 1930s but is unique in the region, and probably in Europe.

If you haven't seen our replica hammer and turntable in operation – and our enhanced lighting of several previously gloomy areas - why not drop in? 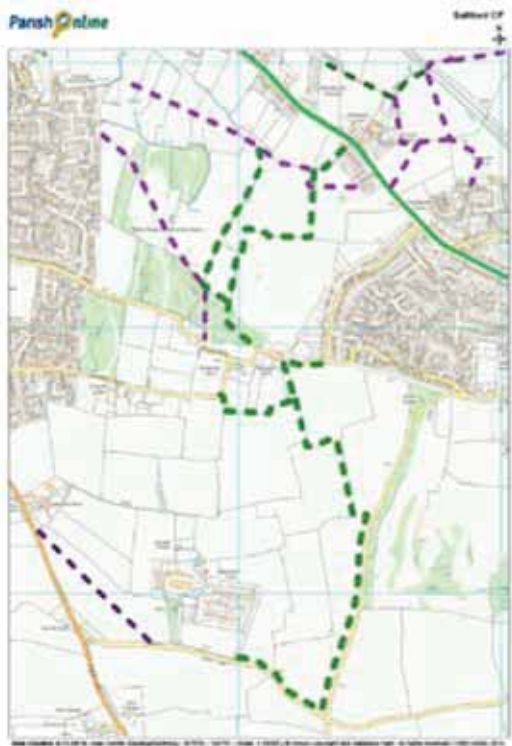

DONATION APPEAL UPDATE

We strongly encouraged you to support financially the continued availability to walkers, runners and horse riders of the 4.5km of permissive paths to the west and south of Saltford. I'm pleased to say that since launching that appeal last time, we have now raised (including Gift Aid) £1700 towards our target of £3000. You have also generously donated a further £720 for the work of the SCA. A huge thank you to those who have already donated.

In order for the permissive paths to remain open next year and beyond, the SCA needs specific donations to raise £3000 and we are now just over half the way there for this year. It needs just another 40 people to donate an average of £25, plus Gift Aid, to reach our target. This is a small price to pay for continuing to enjoy over 4.5km of footpaths.

Without regular, annual donations from residents to cover the costs, the SCA will not be able to keep these paths open and it is highly likely that once closed they will remain closed for ever as the land will be planted with crops.

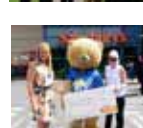

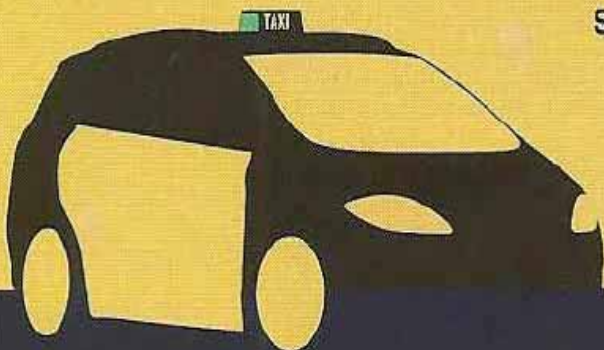
