KEYNSHAM AND SALTFORD PROBUS CLUB

At Keynsham's annual Remembrance Day ceremony, the vice-president of the Club, Chris Primrose, laid a wreath on behalf of both the Keynsham and Saltford Club and of the St Keyna Probus Club (see photo).



The subject of the talk at the November lunch meeting was

"The History of Air Balloons". Speaking without either notes or his Powerpoint material (which refused to load following a Windows 10 upgrade!), Stuart Burroughs, Director of the Museum of Bath at Work, began in the 1780's, when balloons filled either with hot air or with hydrogen were released by enthusiasts, sometimes with tickets attached so that their travels could be monitored. He mentioned the first manned hydrogen balloon flight in England in 1784, and an 1802 ascent from Bath by André-Jacques Garnerin, inventor of the parachute. Accidents were not uncommon - in 1881 the MP for Malmesbury set off from Bath with two others. A strong wind blew them south, and they briefly touched down near Bridport, where the others were thrown out by the landing. The Balloon then rose again and disappeared out to sea with the MP, never to be seen again!

In December, members (and their partners) at the traditional Christmas lunch meeting heard a Christmas Message from the Revd. Phil Hewett, who is also a member of the Club. He drew parallels between a journey he had taken as a young apprentice at BAC, when he travelled in several stages from Filton to his home in Bideford, and the journeys of the shepherds, magi, Mary and Joseph in the Christmas story. All were included in this story, as Phil paused his talk from time to time so that members could join in with some well-known carols.

SALTFORD BRASS MILL

Saltford Brass Mill was in use from the 1720s until 1925 for the manufacture of brass 'hollowware' (pans, vats and kettles) and brass sheet. There were four wheels and four furnaces. The remaining waterwheel survived because it was adapted to drive a dynamo to light a squash court built in the mill in the late 1920s. The single standing furnace structure is unique in the region.

Although the Mill is closed to the public until May, Saltford Brass Mill Project volunteers continue to meet to maintain the mill and develop new ways to explain and show it off to visitors when it reopens. But winter brings its own challenges. Just a few days after the volunteers spent a day moving and lifting vulnerable displays and furniture to higher, dryer storage, the River Avon rose in the wake of storm Angus and came into the mill. Luckily, this time it rose only to a low level, leaving just a small amount of silt to clean up. Fingers crossed for the rest of the winter!

The Brass Mill will be open on 13th and 14th May for National Mills Weekend and then on second and fourth Saturdays until October. If you haven't seen our replica hammer and turntable in operation - why not drop in? SALTFORD ENVIRONMENT GROUP

Roman and 18th Century Saltford

Saltford Environment Group's history project revealed some remarkable aspects of Saltford's history at the end of 2016. Firstly in November Bath and Camerton Archaeological Society (BACAS) assisted by volunteers from SEG completed the geophysics survey of the Roman coffin field on the south side of Saltford that we had started in the autumn of 2015. We appear to have discovered a very large building, approximately 60 metres x 70 metres. This is very close to where the Roman stone coffin complete with Roman skeleton was found in 1948 and in view of the Roman artefacts found at this location this could well be a Roman building (villa). We will publish on our website further information about our discoveries in this field when the BACAS survey report is completed in the early part of 2017.

Then in December we published an image of the oldest painting of Saltford, dated as c.1728. This is of Saltford lock and the Miller's house that subsequently became the Jolly Sailor Inn. Many residents were dismayed to see this painting leave Saltford in 1993 and sold by Christie's after it had been in the Jolly Sailor for some 265 years.



The original painting itself, oil on wood panel, was over 5 feet wide. We have scanned to a high resolution a small and rare photograph taken of the painting in the 1990s, digitally cleaned and colour corrected it, and the resulting image is now on SEG's website.

Measuring 167.2cm x 64.2cm (5' 5.75" x 2' 1.25") and dated at c.1728 by art experts and industrial archaeologists, this is the oldest known painting depicting a Saltford scene.

The lock had been opened in 1727 when the Avon Navigation was opened linking Bath to Bristol. It is thought that the house became an inn, the Jolly Sailor, from the 1740s; the first recorded landlord, from 1749 to 1789, was Francis Hunt.

Despite its simplicity and stretched perspective the painting is an important industrial and social historical record for the River Avon and Saltford. It provides a rare depiction of activity on the river soon after the locks had been built by Bristol-based civil and mechanical engineer John Padmore that allowed river traffic to bypass Saltford and Kelston weirs. The painting shows a sense of prosperity for the Bath to Bristol area, sustained by the industrial activity of the many mills along the River Avon and the amount of river traffic including for pleasure use that had become possible by the new navigation as a result of the installation of locks.

Permissive Paths – Donation Appeal



IMPORTANT UPDATE ABOUT SALTFORD HALL

Over the last 6 years the SCA has been busy fundraising through a variety of community events and will continue to need to do so. We are so grateful for your support of these events and we continue to look forward to seeing you at future events, especially the forthcoming Festival.

The money raised over the last 7 years has allowed us to invest £59,000 in critical maintenance repairs and £87,000 in improvements to the facilities at Saltford Hall. We hope these improvements have been appreciated by the thousands who have used the Hall over the last few years.

The SCA is delighted to announce its most significant improvement to date. Over the next few months the foyer will undergo a major refurbishment that will completely transform this space. The plan below gives an idea of the transformation that will take place including a permanent bar.



With the much appreciated support of Saltford resident Clive Shipley and Arris Construction, working with architect Mike Nangreave, we hope to have this work completed prior to the Festival in June. In the meantime we ask for your patience while the work is undertaken.

We would also like to take this opportunity to thank Francine Haeberling for recently supporting us with a Bath & NES Ward Councillor Initiative grant to significant improve the stage facilities at the Hall. This will be appreciated by many groups at the Hall, not least the Saltford Pantomime at the end of January.

We have also just received a grant from the Quartet Community Foundation under the Bath and West Community Energy Programme towards the installation of "destratification fans" in the main hall. At present, warm air in the hall rises to the high ceiling and much heat is thereby lost. The fans will drive this warm air back down, thus leading to significant saving of energy and of heating costs.



Ward Councillors Initiative Grant from Councillor Francine Haeberling,

We were delighted to receive a grant from Bath & North East Somerset Council for over £3000 to make further improvements to the stage facilities we offer at Saltford Hall. This grant has significantly contributed to the following improvements :-

- 1. Completed the replacement of the original 1950s lighting with modern low energy LEDs. We started this process about 4 years ago following an earlier grant. Our existing lighting was heavy on energy usage and had to have colour gels put into them prior to any performance which limited its versatility as it was not usually possible to change these gels once a performance was underway. Replacing the existing lighting has provided the stage user with a multitude of lighting colours and effects which light the rear half of the stage. The colours can be changed throughout any performance.
- 2. New LED lights on the floor at the front of stage which illuminate the front half of the stage. Having lights on the floor at the front of stage allows performers to have their faces better illuminated as all lights previously at the hall light downwards which can cause shadows especially if the performers are wearing hats.
- 3. Installation of an additional set of drapes down the sides of the stage and across the top. A couple of years ago when we replaced our previous worn out stage clothes we didn't have the money for the required 3 sets and therefore have made do with only 2 sets since. This has caused various productions some problems with gaps on the wings.

The stage area is now used more and more and in particular will benefit Saltford Panto Club, SCA Musical Productions (SCAMP), Saltford Drama Club and Lucy Ratnett's Dance Club, which involve large numbers of local children as well as lots of other hirings. We hugely appreciate this support that Councillor Haeberling was able to organise.


