MESSAGE FROM JOHN DAVIES, CHAIR OF THE SCA

The financial year of the charity has just ended and by the time you read this we will have held the Annual Meeting. It therefore seems an opportune time to give a summary of our financial position to those of you not able to make the meeting.

The headlines are that during the year ending 31 January 2017 we had a total income of £109,670 and total expenses of £99,330 so we had a surplus of just over £10,000, compared with a surplus of just over £19,000 the previous year, due to the success of the Festival in 2015. So we had a pretty good year last year and this was despite spending a further net (after grants) £10,000 on maintenance/ improvements. However, this surplus of £10,000 would once again have been a substantial loss without £23,600 from fundraising, books (on wall and in hall), your generous donations and grants.

These surpluses have been essential in building funds to cover the projected cost of over £30,000 that will be necessary to pay for the much-needed refurbishment of the entrance and foyer areas, which we hope to be undertaken during the coming weeks.

The main items of note financially were :-

- SCAN advertising income remained broadly unchanged after rises of 31% and 30% in previous years
 and despite increased print costs made a reasonable surplus. Our thanks to all our advertisers and to
 the army of volunteers who deliver the SCAN to every house in Saltford.
- Fundraising last year raised over £11,400 and this coming year we hope the 80 plus events during the Festival will once again be enthusiastically supported. A huge thank you to the merry band of volunteers who help to put all these events on and to all of you for supporting so well during the year.
- Reg and Jill Williams, in a new initiative, donated all the money from books on their wall (24 High Street) and in the Hall and last year they were able to raise just over £2000 for the SCA.
- In terms of expenses, gas and electric were up a small bit, despite us taking a number of initiatives to reduce useage.

During the last year we spent a further £17,300 on maintenance and improvements at the Hall, bringing the total over the last 7 years to an amazing £147,000. The main item last year was the completion of the transformation of the stage lighting to LEDs which was greatly helped by a grant from Frances Haeberling through the BANES Ward Councillor's Initiative. Other non-regular items were:

- Repairs to door entry system
- Stage rigging and electrical checks
- Replacement of paying slabs between Hall and Tennis Courts
- · Saltford Hall sign
- · Panto container base
- Architect fees connected with fover refurbishment

As well as the grant mention above from BANES WCI, we are also very grateful to grants from Saltford Parish Council towards the cost of producing SCAN and towards the cost of putting on the forthcoming Festival. Last year we also received a grant from Quartet towards the cost of installing destratification fans in the Main Hall and Stage (see below) and a grant from Waitrose (green tokens!).

During the coming year we will be running our regular cafes and bars alongside other events and organizing another 9 day Festival in June. We will be using the money raised and what we have in the bank already, to progress further improvements this coming year including the total refurbishment of the entrance foyer as highlighted in the last SCAN. Already in this new financial year we have also spent just over £3,000 on the destratification fans that we hope will pay back in a couple of years and further architects fees in respect of the foyer refurbishment.

So just in summary, we have over the last 7 years spent £60,000 on maintenance items, £87,000 on improvements, making a total of £147,000. This has been substantially funded from raising over £85,000 from fundraising activities and £54,000 in grants and bequests.

Many thanks for your invaluable support over the years and in the future to ensuring that Saltford Hall remains a much loved community focus point.

KEYNSHAM FOOTBALL CLUB

As this is written the season for all our teams are heading for the end of their respective seasons

with varying degrees of success. Our First team are still pushing for a top two finish which would give them promotion while our Reserve team is currently in a very strong mid table position. The Under 18 team is currently second in their league but chasing team has a few games in hand. The Under 15's are in a very strong 2nd place with a game against the top team soon. The Under 14's are also in 2nd place but likely to be overtaken by lower teams with games in hand. Unfortunately both our Under 13's and Under 12's are languishing near the bottom of their respective leagues but they both have come up against tough opposition. The results and league tables for younger age groups are not published but fair to say Saltford football at this level is alive and kicking! As a local club covering all age groups we are always looking to the future and hence welcome new players young and old.

However new players are only part of the equation. You may be surprised to discover that the cost of running the two adult teams amounted to some £7000 in 2015-16. This covered everything from First Aid expenditure through to pitch rental and upkeep which cost nearly £3000 alone. One cost not included above is the cost of warmup and playing strip. One set of strip costs in the region of £600 by the time we have the team badge on it – and strip doesn't last that many seasons! In addition there are other things that we would like or need to do, for example we will need a barrier around the First Team pitch if we are to get to the County Premier league. At present the costs of running the two adult teams is met almost entirely by the players. You may have seen the sponsorship drive we undertook recently and as a result we are pleased to welcome I J McGill and Eveleighs Estate Agents to the fold as they have both taken a promotional banner at First Team home matches. However we need to bring more financial support into the club, either by way of increased advertising, kit or team sponsors, or a whole club sponsor. Saltford Football club was established in 1902 and although we will never feature on a Match of the Day line up but is considered an important part of the village and a club worth saving. SALTFORD BRASS MILL OPENS AGAIN TO THE PUBLIC FOR THE WEEKEND OF 13/14 MAY - National Mills Weekend. Then we will be open on Saturday 27 May and for both weekends of the Saltford Festival. We will have interesting joint displays, talks and demonstrations relating to metallurgy and metal working in history – check the Festival programme for details. Then we open on the second and fourth Saturdays each month until October with some additional Sundays when there are special events in the area. We are very happy to host GROUP VISITS by arrangement.

Saltford Brass Mill Project volunteers have continued to meet through the winter to care for the mill and develop new ways to explain and show it off to visitors, with only small floods to clean up his winter. We were delighted to host early visits from Huron University in Ontario and Year 4 from Saltford School. Fingers crossed for no spring flooding!

Saltford Brass Mill was in use from the 1720s until 1925 for the manufacture of brass pans, vats and kettles and brass sheet. There were four waterwheels and four annealing furnaces. The remaining waterwheel survived because it was adapted to drive a dynamo to light a squash court built in the mill in the late 1920s. The single standing annealing furnace structure survived as a wine cellar in the 1930s but is unique in the region.

JACK'S DAY



Every week in the UK at least 12 young people die suddenly from undiagnosed heart conditions. A lot of people in the UK may not be aware of this but for people in Keynsham and Saltford sadly we know this fact all to well. It will be 8 years this August since Jack Boutlon passed away due to an undiagnosed heart condition which rocked the local community and left a big hole in all



our lives.

Every year family, friends and the local community gather together at the Saltford sports club to celebrate the life of Jack Boulton and raise money for the charity CRY. Cardiac Risk in the Young (CRY) has been working to reduce the frequency of young sudden cardiac death. They offer bereavement support to families affected by young sudden cardiac death (YSCD) and promotes heart screening programmes as well as funding medical research.

Over the last 8 years we have raised a tremendous amount of money for CRY. Money raised last year was used to fund a screening day for the local community.

Preparations for Jack's Day 2017 are well underway and we expect it to be the biggest and best yet. It will be held on Friday 26th May 2017 at Saltford Sports Club starting at 19:00 and finishing late into the night.

This year there will be a football match between Saltford AFC V Keynsham cricket club (kick off 18:45). There will also be Live music, DJ, BBQ, Raffle, bar and auction (previous prizes included an Audi experience, signed Manchester united shirt, signed rugby shirt and other signed sports memorabilia).

Obviously this event cannot be a successful without the support of the Keynsham and Saltford community....If anyone can help on the day or donate raffle prizes we would be very grateful.

This is an open event...we encourage you to invite friends and family to support this amazing cause and continue making this event a roaring success.

All proceeds from the day with go to CRY. We look forward to seeing you on the 26th May.

DONATION APPEAL UPDATE

In the last SCAN we encouraged you to support financially the continued availability to walkers, runners and horse riders of the 4.5km of permissive paths to the west and south of Saltford. I'm pleased to say that since launching that appeal last time, we have now raised (including Gift Aid) £1200 towards our target of £3000. You have also generously donated a further £540 for the work of the SCA. A huge thank you to those who have already donated.

In order for the permissive paths to remain open next vear and beyond, the SCA needs specific donations to raise £3000 and we are pleased that we are already 40% of the way there this year. It needs just another 60 people to donate an average of £25, plus Gift Aid, to reach our target. This is a small price to pay for continuing to enjoy over 4.5km of footpaths.





On Fridays the morning traffic builds up more slowly.
