GIANT HOGWEED WARNING

Residents may recall that the toxic, alien and invasive plant Giant Hogweed was discovered by Saltford Environment Group's wildlife adviser in 2014 by the side of the railway path between Saltford and Bitton.



This particular clump has taken several attempts by B&NES to eradicate it but it is proving stubborn as it makes a re-appearance each year including in 2017 (we have reported this to B&NES) although it is a weaker plant than before as a result of repeated attempts to poison its root system.

Last year a resident discovered three massive Giant Hogweed plants growing in her garden after using locally sourced mulch that contained the plant's seeds. This highly toxic non-native plant has to be treated with care and removed by specialists.

Contact with its sap or its bristles can cause severe skin burns depending on individual sensitivity. It can sensitize skin to ultra-violet light (sunlight), leading to severe blisters, pigmentation and longlasting scars; hospitalisation may be necessary. Affected skin may remain sensitive for several years. A minute amount of sap in the eye can lead to temporary or even permanent blindness.

If you find Giant Hogweed growing in Saltford, please advise B&NES Council (Council Connect on

01225 39 40 41) as soon as possible - and let SEG know too. For your own safety DO NOT TOUCH or attempt to remove it yourself. When removed, under the Environmental Protection Act (1990) Giant Hogweed is classified as controlled waste. Anyone working amongst Giant Hogweed should wear protective clothing that covers the whole body including gloves, hood and face visor.

SEG provides further information and pictures of Giant Hogweed on our website's wildlife page – it can easily be confused with Common Hogweed a smaller and common native plant.

example, and subject to support from volunteers, the Heritage Centre could be opened for special community events whilst elements of its mobile and flexible display could support relevant events at other venues in Saltford. KEYNSHAM & SALTFORD HISTORY SOC

The Society's summer programme of visits and walks continues. In early June, members enjoyed a coach trip to Mottisfont in Hampshire to discover a most interesting National Trust property that started life as a priory and went through several major re-buildings, so that the only signs of the original structure are visible in the cellars and a few cut-outs in more recent walls. The house has belonged to several families but the final owners, Maud and Gilbert Russell who arrived in 1934, gave us the building we have today. They made Mottisfont the centre of a fashionable artistic and political circle and under Maud's guidance, rooms were reconfigured and redecorated, creating a neo-classical, luxurious look with some unique features. As well as the house, the rose gardens were well worth seeing and a stop at Marlborough for tea on the way back made for a varied day. Our most recent day out, to Bristol Docks, was certainly memorable! It was organized by Saltford member and M-Shed volunteer Alan Salter, who combined demonstrations of his crane-driving skills with a fascinating description of the Docks when they were working. Members also toured the Docks as far as the Cumberland Basin on the fire-fighting boat Pryronaut and visited the M-Shed stores, where the museum keeps a huge collection of artefacts, ranging from Victorian perambulators to printing presses, that are not usually on display.

Next on the programme is a coach trip on Wednesday 13th September, to west Somerset. After a short stop at Watchet we have a guided tour of Cleeve Abbey, a site that is partly-ruined but retains buildings that give a flavour of what a medieval abbey would have been like to live in; it also has one of the best displays of medieval floor tiles. We then move on to the picture-postcard village of Dunster, where you have the opportunity to visit the Castle. The coach leaves from Keynsham Parish Church, picking up at The Talbot. We decided to make a Rose Wine for our Members' Recipe Competition and each individual's wine will be judged by the members at our December meeting. Percy Mellor offered us three different Rose's to choose and the one decided upon was as follows:

3 litres of White Grape Juice (not concentrate); 1 litre of Summer fruits flavoured water; 1 lb sugar; 1 teaspoon Bentonite; No. 5 Gervin Yeast; 1

teaspoon yeast nutrient; 1 teaspoon Pectolaise; 1 teaspoon tartaric acid; 50 mls Strawberry flavouring, when fermentation is complete.

If anyone would like to try it, it is an ideal drink for this time of year. However, making wine is not an essential part of being a member of the Wine Circle!

In June Commodore Ian Gibb M.B.E told us about his life "From Cadet to Commodore and Beyond". His family had been in the shipping business in Rotterdam before coming to England to escape the second World War. He became a cadet with the P & O Shipping line and told us of his experiences - notably sliding down a stairway while saluting, much to the amusement of his Commanding Officer. While he was a Commodore he travelled to various lands and was able to tell a few tales about "Madame Whiplash" and his meetings (entirely innocent) with her.

SALTFORD BRASS MILL

Saltford Brass Mill had very busy two weekends during the Saltford Festival. We were delighted to welcome colleagues from the Roman Baths and Pump Room, with talks, demonstrations and hands-on experience relating to metallurgy and metal working in history. We have enjoyed visits from West Wiltshire U3A and Pensford History Society an exciting visit from Saltford Brownies. We open on the second and fourth Saturdays each month until October with some additional Saturdays and Sundays when there are special events in the area or nationwide. We are very happy to host more GROUP VISITS on other days by arrangement.

As well as guiding visitors on open days and for Group Visits, Saltford Brass Mill Project volunteers meet through the year to care for the mill and garden and develop new ways to interpret it for visitors. We are delighted to continue liaison with several projects establishing walking routes and raising historical and cultural awareness in the Avon valley. Several more local organisations have already arranged visits. At our AGM in June it was reported that we had over 600 visitors in 2016!

Saltford Brass Mill was in use from the 1720s until 1925 for the manufacture of "hollow ware" (brass pans, vats and kettles) and brass sheet. There were four waterwheels and four annealing furnaces. The remaining waterwheel is made of iron and survived because it was adapted to drive a dynamo to provide electric light for a squash court built in the mill in the late 1920s. The single standing annealing furnace structure survived as a wine cellar in the 1930s and is unique in the region, and probably in Europe.

If you haven't seen our replica hammer and turntable in operation — and our enhanced lighting of several previously gloomy areas and new water-power models - why not drop in? Also the team is always looking for NEW MEMBERS in all

KEYNSHAM TALKING NEWSPAPER

A new website, created by a student at Bath College, will give members of the Keynsham Talking Newspaper access to local news online for the first time.

Level 3 IT student Peter Day has been working on the website, for blind and partially sighted people in Keynsham, Saltford and the surrounding area.

At the moment, members of the Keynsham Talking Newspaper, known locally as KTN, receive a memory stick in the post once a week.

This allows them to listen to interviews, community features and lifestyle articles, but now they will also be able to listen to this content online.

Peter, who has just completed his course at Bath College, hopes that the website will transform the way KTN works, saving money and allowing more people to listen in.

He said: "A website is a great tool, for people who want to set up a business or run an organisation – it helps get your name out there.

"It's their first website and if they upload the newspaper to the website for people to listen, it will be a big money saver for them.

"The website needed to be simple, allowing people to navigate it themselves, with a media player behind the words. The main challenge was making sure it was readable, which is why the website is yellow with a large font."

Students at Bath College have been offering to build websites for clients, helping them to test the skills they learn in the classroom and gain experience.

They have also been completing websites for the Chippenham Gateway Club, and Art in the Arch, a project to transform the St James Viaduct, a Grade II listed row of railway arches on Lower Bristol Road, into gallery space.

Peter, 18, from Bradford on Avon, will help with the upkeep of the KTN website and will use the experience to help him apply for a job or an apprenticeship.

He said: "It's been a good experience. I've learned quite a lot about working with clients and producing a website for someone who has a real-life need.

"I put five programme languages into it, including PHP and JavaScript, and I had to think about site security, so that members could login with their own code.

"I'm glad I came to study IT at Bath College. I had the choice of sixth form, but I had been at school for five years, so I decided to go to college and make new friends.

"If you go to college, you'll be trained for industry, whereas if you go to sixth form you'll continue learning theory. I've met quite a few employers who have come into the college, it helps you to network and plan your future."

DONATION APPEAL UPDATE


We have just reached £2000 towards our annual target of £3000

There is rarely the opportunity to recognise those people who are simply 'there'; reliable, motivated and generous. We want you all to know that the success of the festival was down to everyone.



In this short article we have not attempted to mention all the events, but simply to give a flavour of the amazing festival 9 days, which coincided with the major refurbishment of the foyer at Saltford Hall.

The week started on Saturday 10th June, with the village crier and his bell, followed by the festival opening by BBC Radio Bristol's Emma Britton. We

would like to thank her for taking the time to talk to around 30 organisations who were represented at the Open Morning. The famous Saltford Community Cafe, with Newton Farm Bacon Butties, did nothing for village waist lines! During the afternoon and evening Saltford Sports Club put on a wonderful range of sport and music activities for the inaugural Saltford Super Saturday. In the evening



the Village Choir gave a very successful concert for over 100 people. There was also an opportunity all afternoon to walk around the village visiting various gardens.



The weather was with us on The Old Village Day and indeed for all the week! Songs of Praise rang out from the Church. Visitors were greeted to music by the Savages Swing Band in the Tunnel House and "Admiral Kelly" outside his former home at Saltford House. We also had musical entertainment by a Ukelele Band and Now & Then, plus dancing by The Farandole Dancers and Somerset Morris. Our local MP, Jacob Rees-Mogg, was also seen dancing with the Farandole Dancers, of whom he is patron. This was all in the idyllic backdrop of roses and afternoon tea at Saltford Manor. Around the corner was a traditional Punch and Judy show and the, now legendary, Dog Show was very well attended behind the church. In the Church Hall there was the exhibition of paintings by Avon Valley Painters while upstairs the new Heritage Centre was open for the first time. The Church opened all week for the flower display. Stalls in the street

were in abundance and if you walked to the Brass Mill and on to the Car Show more treats were in store including an opportunity to have a go in a dragon boat. In Saltford House the

Scouts and Guides had much to tempt you, while in Jeffery's Lodge the organisation was great for games for younger children.

Evening events during the week kicked off with a sell-out 160 at the quiz. On Tuesday evening local group Decade Dolls performed at a Diva and Desserts night, while Wednesday evening saw the return of the Bath Circle of Magicians to enthral the audience



accompanied by chicken casserole. Thursday evening was another sell-out jazz evening featuring Hannah Wedlock and the Blue Notes accompanied by curry and rice. A change of pace on Friday night saw a Community Cinema showing of the film Jackie. Earlier on Friday there had been a cooked breakfast on offer followed by an upcycling/recycling morning.

Throughout the week local history, geology and the parish walks all took place and every lunchtime there were fascinating talks in the Church Hall rounded off by a packed session taken by Jacob Rees-Mogg MP on Friday on the subject of How Parliament Works. Throughout morning, afternoon and evenings at Saltford Hall there were numerous opportunities to experience free taster sessions at a huge variety of classes, sporting and otherwise, which we hope many people enjoyed and will continue with after the Festival.

The final weekend kicked off with a Festival Flea Market accompanied by our community café. This was immediately followed by the hugely successful school fair during the afternoon. Saturday was rounded off by Saltford Drama Club putting on a school reunion themed sell out murder mystery evening. This was accompanied by bangers and mash followed by pudding and custard — easy when you say but when scaled up 150 times gave the kitchen some challenges which they met!





The finale on Sunday 18th June was this year at Saltford Golf Club for the first time. It was an extremely hot day and the crowd there enjoyed trick golf demonstration, beer & cider festival, live bands and singers, hog roast and BBQ, fairground attractions and much more.

We were delighted by the number of people who wrote and entered poems or contributed photos for the 2018 Calendar. The poetry books printed are sold out but can be bought via Arason and you can see elsewhere in

this SCAN how to purchase the 2018 calendar in aid of SCA and SEG.

Finally we have to mention all the effort people went to in constructing wonderful scarecrows around the village - congratulations and many thanks. The creativity and ingenuity of people never ceases to amaze. The standard was as high as ever and gave the trail followers an interesting time checking them out.

The festival lives on through the new friendships formed and old ones renewed. During the festival the village comes together, to understand its completeness, to marvel at the talent in the community and to consider the importance of valuing traditional aspects of our culture as well as modern innovation.



Financially the 9 exhausting days raised £20,000 with the majority split between the SCA and Saltford School. However, the following organisation also benefited – Saltford Sports Club, Saltford Golf Club, Saltford Tennis Club, Parkinsons UK, Citzens Advice B&NES, Brave the Shave and Saltford Village Choir.
